Mission

The mission of the MNCC is to enhance visibility of the international community in Minnesota by promoting the countries represented by supporting the members' initiatives with respect to their diplomatic outreach, and by fostering foreign trade and cultural initiatives. According to the 1963 Vienna Convention on Consular Relations, ratified by 180 countries, the primary consular duties of our members are "protecting in the receiving State the interests of the sending State and of its nationals, both individuals and bodies corporate, within the limits permitted by international law" and "furthering the development of commercial, economic, cultural, and scientific relations between the sending State and the receiving State." The Minnesota Consular Corps is a member of Global Minnesota and the Consular Corps College, and also works closely with the Minnesota Trade Office, which serves as the State of Minnesota's Office of Protocol.
